# BUILDING VIABLE, THRIVING & SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITIES THROUGH AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Southside Community Development and Housing Corporation

**(SCDHC)** is a Richmond, metro area community development corporation focused on cultivating housing and financial self-sufficiency for the underserved and predominantly women-led households. It is Central Virginia's oldest, historically Black-led community development corporation. With more than 30 years of service, SCDHC's mission is to build viable, thriving, and sustainable communities through affordable housing and wrap-around support services.

SCDHC has built homes in over a dozen neighborhoods and developments throughout the Richmond area, totaling over 750 units of affordable housing with 450 as single-family affordable homes. In 2022, the organization served nearly 800 clients through housing counseling and educational services, including foreclosure prevention, rent relief, and workforce development tools.

# CREATING TREANINGFUL & EMPOWERING EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES


**Cameron's Coffee & Chocolates** is a business enterprise of non-profit **Everyl Can Work** and provides permanent employment opportunities for young adults living with developmental and intellectual disabilities.

At Cameron's Coffee & Chocolates, employees with intellectual disabilities develop essential workforce readiness skills that serve them beyond their time at the shop and into their broader lives and careers. They work alongside volunteers and culinary specialists to produce delicious chocolates as well as other food products and services.

Cameron's Coffee & Chocolates first opened in 2013 with three employees. Now in its 10<sup>th</sup> year of business, the store employs 23 workers with intellectual disabilities and serves as a model enterprise across the United States and even to other nations on how to most effectively empower workers with disabilities.

# ENCOURAGING SPACEFLIGHT AND EXPLORATION AMONG STUDENTS


Established in 1998, **Virginia Space Flight Academy (VASFA)** is an educational nonprofit partnered with NASA's Wallops Island Flight Facility that encourages space flight and STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) studies through a combination of year-round classroom programming and summer camps.

VASFA's camps and programs aim to spark interest and expand opportunities for students interested in learning about space flight and exploration. Strengthened through partnerships with national players in the space industry, VASFA holds a Space Act agreement with NASA that allows campers behind-the-scenes access to NASA's flight facilities on Virginia's Wallops Island.

Having served over 6,000 students since its founding, VASFA celebrates its  $25^{\rm th}$  year in operation in 2023. VASFA camp operations and educational offerings continue to grow and draw students from all over the Commonwealth and across the country.

# SUPPORTING OUR NATION'S HEROES IN THE AFTERMATH OF TRAUMA


**Boulder Crest Foundation** is a nonprofit retreat facility that serves veterans, first responders, and their families. The Foundation provides evidence-backed practices to encourage Posttraumatic Growth programming and restoration while conducting invaluable research. Since opening its doors in 2013, Boulder Crest has served 3,500 Virginians and an estimated 100,000 persons across America at no cost to participants.

With 37 beautiful acres in Northern Virginia complete with a labyrinth, garden, horse therapy, sport facilities, communal areas and more, as well as a second facility in Southwest Arizona, Boulder Crest provides a place for individuals to find peace, draw strength, and interact with others with similar experiences. Boulder Crest Foundation is setting the standard for productive and effective ways to help our Nation's heroes and their families.

# PRIORITIZING CONSERVATION AND SPORTSMANSHIP IN THE COMMONWEALTH

The Wildlife Foundation of Virginia (WFV) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to conserving land, providing public access and outdoor recreational opportunities, and strengthening the commitment of the Commonwealth to conservation and sportsmanship.

Founded in 1997, WFV inspires a passion for outdoor recreation in the form of hunting, fishing, and exploring nature. WFV has been integral in acquiring and preserving nearly 14,000 acres of Virginia's land. To cater to Wounded Warriors, veterans, and mobility-impaired individuals, the nonprofit built wheelchair-accessible blinds and offers a four-wheel utility vehicle for transport.

WFV also specializes in hunts and workshops designed for younger generations to help spark a love of nature, while teaching care of the world around them. In 2014 the foundation launched a grant program that provides funding to schools, agencies, and nonprofits that connect youth to nature. This grant program has benefited more than 69,000 youth across the Commonwealth.

# REBUILDING HOPE AND HOMES AFTER DEVASTATION

God's Pit Crew is a faith-based disaster response team of over 1,100 volunteers who respond in times of tragedy. Motivated by the devastating Oklahoma City tornadoes of 1999, Danville residents Randy and Terri Johnson began a mission to serve countless communities throughout Virginia, across the nation, and abroad that have been affected by disaster.

Today, God's Pit Crew has expanded to a national, volunteer-backed operation combating humanitarian crises caused by hurricanes, wildfires, and other destructive events. In 2022, the organization distributed over 3.4 million pounds of food, water, and essential products to individuals and families across the United States, as well as over 30,000 survival kits colloquially known as "Blessing Buckets." God's Pit Crew volunteers are also dedicated to building new homes for wounded veterans, widows, natural disaster victims, children's homes, and families in need — erecting hope out of the ashes.
